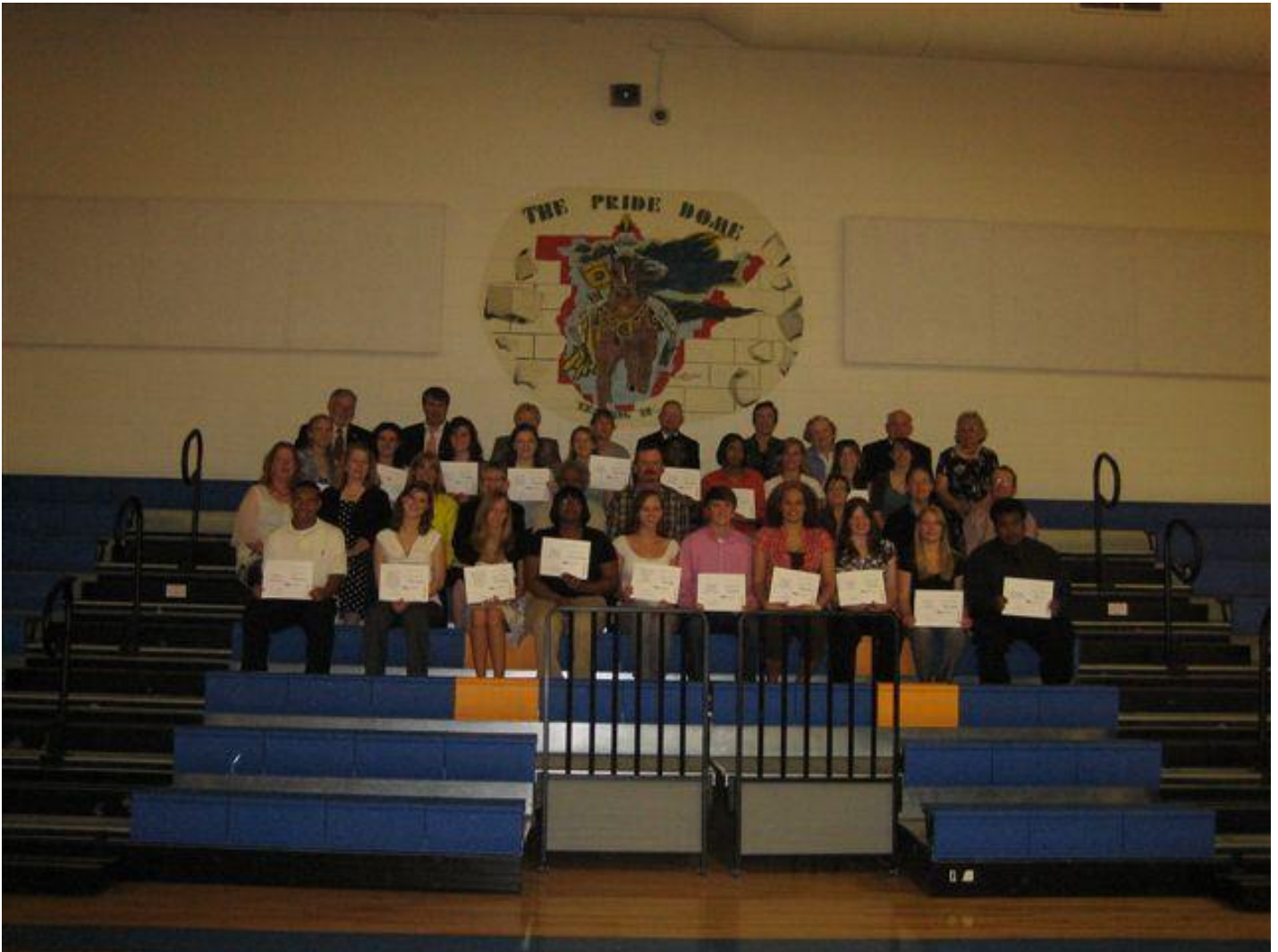


2011 Cumberland County Public Schools Foundation, Inc.
Biographical Sketches of Scholarship Recipients
